## **Remote Learning Offer for families at Snitterfield Primary School**

## 2020-2021

In the event of a child needing to self isolate:  This is likely to be an absence from school of between 2 and 5 days whilst your child (or the affected family member) awaits test results.	<ul> <li>On the first day you should go onto the Oak National Academy webpage (<a href="https://www.thenational.academy/">https://www.thenational.academy/</a>), go to Lessons and find your child's year group. There are all sorts of activities across the curriculum which your child can choose to do.</li> <li>From the second day there will be learning activities available on Teams. These activities will be similar to what is going on in class. However, if you would like to supplement these you can still access Oak National Academy for additional activities.</li> </ul>
In the event of a bubble closing: Bubbles will close when a child tests positive and the closure will be for 14 days from when the affected child started to show COVID symptoms.  This could be for up to 14 days, but might be for a shorter period depending on the time taken for test	<ul> <li>As staff will also be affected they will ensure that learning is available on Teams from the first day of absence. Staff will ensure that they monitor Teams for any messages and queries that children/parents post there. Please do not send work by email to teachers.</li> <li>Staff will provide quality feedback on 4 pieces of work per week – these will be indicated for you and should be uploaded as per instructions. Ask the class teacher if you're not sure.</li> <li>Staff will also be inviting the class to general 'meetings' at specific times – please look out for this. There will be a specific purpose for the meeting and we expect that all children will be</li> </ul>
In the event of a local/national lockdown:	The information we have is that this option is a last resort as schools will be one of the last services to close.  However, in this scenario please follow the instructions as for a bubble closure.

## Please note that:

- Schools are not required to provide remote learning for absences not related to coronavirus, although if you access Teams you may find work posted there by the teacher.
- School does not expect children who are poorly with coronavirus symptoms to complete work.
- As attendance expectations have now changed, and all children are expected to be at school, then we also expect that ALL CHILDREN will complete their home learning tasks in the above scenarios.
